



Heritage Fleet Facility - Background

Executive Summary

The Victorian Heritage Fleet – comprising the tall ship Alma Doepel, Steam Tug Wattle, and Enterprize – faces imminent eviction from its long-standing restoration site at Collins Wharf, Docklands. Development Victoria (DV) issued a Notice to Vacate in January 2025, despite earlier assurances that the site would not be required for at least two years. Following public and media concern, an extension was granted to December 2025. However, despite working with Development Victoria in good faith, no alternative location has been confirmed, and negotiations remain unresolved.

DV's preferred option, Seaworks Williamstown, is outside its jurisdiction, under repair until 2026, and financially unviable. A rent of \$120,000 per year has been proposed for what are currently substandard facilities. The Heritage Fleet seeks funding for an interim solution within Docklands and a government commitment to a permanent maritime heritage precinct within Docklands.

Immediate government intervention is required to preserve this vital cultural and community asset.

Background

The Alma Doepel was invited to Docklands in 2009 by Development Victoria (then VicUrban) to activate the precinct and reconnect Victoria Harbour with its working maritime heritage. Over 16 years, the project has become a major cultural, educational, and volunteer-led initiative delivering significant community benefit.

Assessment of Seaworks (Williamstown)

The Seaworks site is unsuitable for the Fleet's operations. The pier is closed for repairs until 2026, sheds are in disrepair, and the facilities lack appropriate dock access and infrastructure. Seaworks seeks \$120,000 annual rent, which exceeds the Fleet's volunteer-based budget.

Proposed Interim Solution – 533 Docklands Drive

The public land at 533 Docklands Drive, adjacent to the Ron Barassi Snr Oval, offers a feasible interim home. It would accommodate temporary sheds and berthing, maintain visibility, and preserve operations while a permanent Docklands site is secured.

Requested Government Action

- 1. Approve the interim relocation to 533 Docklands Drive and assist with logistics.
- 2. Commit to establishing a long-term maritime heritage precinct in Docklands.
- 3. Re-establish a transparent working group between DV, City of Melbourne, Visit Victoria, and the Heritage Fleet.

Conclusion

The Heritage Fleet was invited to Docklands by government to celebrate Victoria's maritime heritage. Without intervention, the Fleet faces eviction and disbandment, undermining community trust and Docklands' cultural identity. Urgent action is required to secure an interim and permanent home.
